Thank you for your assistance!

I would like to clarify the archiving policy according to a post-print/author's accepted manuscript version of an article. Do you have the same policy for postprint/author's accepted manuscript version of an article as for a published article?

Typically, post-prints are the article as published in terms of **content**, but not in terms of appearance, as publishers often reserve for themselves their own arrangement of type-setting and formatting. A post-print is a version without the journal's formatting (page numbers, volume etc.). Illustrations and tables usually appear at the end of the manuscript (the post-print).
